

To truly understand its unique characteristics, we must first break it down and look at what is actually in fishmeal and how farmed fish benefit from consuming it.

Fishmeal and fish oil have a multiplier effect

The overall fed aquaculture figure is for every 0.22kg of whole wild fish used in fishmeal production, a kilo of farmed fish is produced. In other words, for every 1 kg of wild fish used 4.5 kg of farmed fish is produced.
