The global farmed salmon industry developed at an experimental stage in the 1960s and became an industry later, in the 1980s and 1990s. Today, the carbon footprint of farmed salmon is 0.60 whereas chicken's is 0.88, pork's is 1.30 and beef's is 5.92.
