

THE RIGHTS AND DUTIES OF IFFO NON-PRODUCER MEMBERS

Members' Rights

a. For All Non-Producer Members

- To receive all IFFO reports, publications, and communications applicable to Non-Producer members, including the complete list of members.
- Access to the password-protected members-only sections of the IFFO website.
- Access to the Members' Meeting and member's discount on registration for the Annual Conference.
- Access to the open Market Forums sessions held at Member's Meeting and Annual Conferences
- Access to IFFO's worldwide resources to address individual member queries, as applicable.
- Access to the Technical and Regulatory Network and IFFO Communications groups, enabling members to share knowledge, exchange views on projects, receive regulatory and technical updates, and propose ideas.
- To register regional offices worldwide to receive full membership benefits.
- Representation and advocacy by IFFO on matter relevant to the industry.

b. Additional for Premium Non-Producer members

- To receive the full Weekly Report with price information.
- Access to the closed session during Market Forums sessions held at Member's Meeting and Annual Conferences.
- Eligibility to contract the China MOARA Import License application service at IFFO rates (the license is compulsory for access to the Chinese market).

Members' Duties

a. For all Non-Producer members

- To abide by IFFO's Code of Conduct, as published on the IFFO website.
- To uphold the interests of IFFO and refrain from any action that could bring the Organisations' name into disrepute.
- To promptly settle membership fees within 15 days from the date of invoicing. If a member decides to leave IFFO and subsequently seeks to rejoin in the future, the company will be required to settle any outstanding or overdue fees prior to re-admission.
- To not distribute members-only information to non-members.

b. Additional for Premium Non-Producer members

- To actively share information and participate in the Market Forums, including being prepared to comment on market trends within their specific area of expertise, not only during formal meetings but also through regular individual calls with IFFO staff. This includes, as applicable:
 - Shippers and brokers: sharing information on logistics costs, capacity, and market trends.
 - Traders: sharing information on demand, consumption patterns, and stock levels.
 - Feed companies: sharing information on feed market trends, including the inclusion and substitution of fishmeal and fish oil.
 - Oil refiners and human nutraceutical manufacturers: sharing information on market developments and trends, including fish oil for human consumption.
 - All Premium Non-Producer categories: sharing non-proprietary developments from their specialist sector that may be of benefit to the industry (e.g. financial instruments, engineering processes and systems, laboratory techniques, etc.).

All information provided will be treated as confidential and will only be disclosed back to members in a consolidated form.

Action in the Event of Non-Compliance:

In the event of continued non-compliance after due warnings have been issued, membership privileges may be withdrawn by resolution of the Management Board, without any obligation to refund membership fees for the year concerned. Any decision to expel a member from IFFO shall be subject to the issue of two formal written warnings by IFFO, including an initial specific complaint and a final written warning issued by the Director General.
